Fayetteville, NC — The Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra today announced their 2014-2015 season, which includes 4 Masterworks concerts and 3 concerts in the Salon Series at St. John's. This season schedule is supported by a grant from the Arts Council of Fayetteville/Cumberland County. The support received from the Arts Council grant enables the FSO to keep ticket costs affordable and accessible for our community.

In addition to the season concerts, the Fayetteville Symphony provides a concert for all third grade students in Cumberland County Schools. This year there will be a joint performance of Amadeus with Cape Fear Regional Theatre which will have school performances for 11th grade students.

"Operating Support grants are designed to strengthen our community through the arts," says Deborah Martin Mintz, Executive Director of the Arts Council.
