FAYETTEVILLE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA TO PERFORM TWO CHAMBER MUSIC CONCERTS IN HISTORIC ST. JOHN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN JANUARY

Musicians of the Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra (FSO) will be performing two chamber music concerts in the month of January in historic St. John's Episcopal Church in Downtown Fayetteville. The first concert will be held on Thursday, January 12 at 7:30pm showcasing the FSO principal string musicians performing Mozart's *Eine kleine Nachtmusik*, and the second concert will be held on Thursday, January 26 at 7:30pm featuring FSO woodwind, brass, and string principals performing Handel's *Water Music*. Additional pieces will also be performed on each concert.

Mozart's *Eine kleine Nachtmusik* is probably one of the most well-known pieces of music ever composed even to this day. The best description for anyone that has no music background is that parts of it used to be used as the first ring-tone for most Nokia cell phones! Handel's *Water Music* is also a popular chamber piece - originally written to be performed on the River Thames for King George I in 1717, *Water Music* also includes several well-known tunes that are a joy to listen to, and easy on the ear.

Tickets are \$27 for adults, \$24 for seniors and military, \$11 for students with a valid ID and children 6-18, and children 5 and under are free. Seating is limited to 300 for each concert, so the Fayetteville Symphony encourages people to purchase their tickets in advance to guarantee themselves a seat.
