**FAYETTEVILLE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA STARTS THEIR
2015-2016 SEASON ON OCTOBER 17 WITH THEIR
BEETHOVEN AND BLUE JEANS CONCERT**

The Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra will be starting their 2015-2016 season on Saturday, October 17 with their Beethoven and Blue Jeans Concert in Huff Concert Hall at Methodist University. The concert starts at 7:30pm and will feature the full orchestra with Music Director Fouad Fakhouri conducting. The performance will include Beethoven's *Coriolan Overture*, Beethoven's *Symphony No. 7* (a piece that Beethoven claims himself to be his "best work"), and Beethoven's *Triple Concerto* featuring a solo performance by FSO's own Fabián López (Concertmaster), Nate Leyland (Principal Cello), and Scott Marosek (Principal Piano). This family-friendly concert is a perfect Saturday night outing for families and friends. The symphony encourages people to dress in their jeans as the musicians themselves will be performing in jeans on stage!
