IF IT "AIN'T" BAROQUE...

Fayetteville, NC — On Thursday, January 16th, 2020 at 7:30 p.m., the Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra will perform music from the Baroque period at Saint John's Episcopal Church 302 Green Street, Fayetteville, NC.

The Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra will be performing music from the Baroque period. The symphony will perform the first half of the concert beginning with "Rondo" from Suite de Symphonies by Jean-Joseph Mouret; "Sinfonia, The Arrival of the Queen of Sheba" from Act III of Solomon by George Frederic Handel, "Adagio in G minor for Strings and Organ" by Tomaso Albinoni, and "Canon and Gigue in D" by Johann Pachelbel. After a brief intermission, the concert will conclude with "Orchestral Suite No.3 in D" by Johann Sebastian Bach.
