FAYETTEVILLE SYMPHONY ORCHESTRA PERFORMS MUSICAL FOLKTALES

Fayetteville, NC — On Saturday, April 4th, 2020 at 7:30 p.m., the Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra will perform a repertoire of folk music composed by Johannes Brahms, Antonín Dvořák, and Bedřich Smetana. The performance will take place at Huff Auditorium on the campus of Methodist University, 5400 Ramsey Street, Fayetteville, NC.

The Fayetteville Symphony Orchestra will be performing folk music by Johannes Brahms, Antonín Dvořák, and Bedřich Smetana. The symphony will perform the first half of the concert beginning with “Hungarian Dances No.6 and Hungarian Dances No.5” both by Johannes Brahms, “Slavonic Dances Op. 72, No.2 in E minor” by Antonín Dvořák, and “Vlatava (The Moldau) from Má Vlast (My Fatherland)” by Bedřich Smetana. After a brief intermission, the concert will conclude with “Cello Concerto in B minor, Op.104” by Antonín Dvořák featuring Nate Leyland, principal cellist.
